The **40 Days for Life Fall Kickoff** was held on September 10th at Saint Catherine of Siena Catholic Church, 1618 King Ben Road Kennesaw, GA 30144. The keynote speaker was Dr. John Bruchalski author of the book 'Two Patients, My Conversion from Abortion to Life-Affirming Medicine'.

What a fantastic speaker and the content of his speech were outstanding.

We were also honored to have Rich Owens recipient of the 2023 Sue Thayer Leader of the year award. He gave a very energizing speech on "Truth" - "As a sidewalk counselor how to bring Truth about abortion to Planned Parenthood clients".

The Fall Campaign runs September 25th thru November 3rd in 703 cities. This will be the largest campaign ever.

On the National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children on Saturday September 14, we visited the burial places of the unborn victims of abortion and other memorial sites dedicated to them. St. Joseph Catholic Church has applied to be included on the National Registry. A rosary was held at St. Joseph Catholic Church after the 8:00 am Mass.

Every October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates the Respect Life Month on the first Sunday of October. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning to the end of their lives, and at every point in between. During

October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human life. In memory of the 1.8 million babies killed each year by abortion there will be 100 crosses on the front lawn of the church property. We refer to this as the Cemetery of the Innocents.

Please consider spending 60 minutes in prayer outside of Planned Parenthood. You have no idea of the impact that is had when people see peaceful, prayerful people holding signs to support life and end abortion.
