Final report on our Lenten Fish Frys:

We served 2,228 paid meals over 6 weeks, averaging 371.3 per week, up from previous averages of around

240. About 15% of the growth was organic, with most due to increased attendance by the Hispanic population of our parish, leading to some lasting connections. Several people recommended a "Hispanic Night" for next year. Our dessert table, sponsored by different youth groups each week, raised over \$2,000 in donations. Several groups have expressed interest in sponsoring the dessert table next year.

Annamarie Scavelli, our youth minister at Holy Family, agreed to a partnership with our Knight's Council and her high school youth group in the Fifth Station service program. Young volunteers helped the elderly and young parents by carrying meals to their tables, earning appreciation from the community. We look forward to partnering with them again.

Father Miguel challenged us to form "one community" at Holy Family Parish. Our interactions with the Hispanic community during the 2025 fish fry events have opened that door. I am proud of all the Brother Knights who participated.

May 2025 is known as Mary's Month. On Tuesday, May 13th we remember Our Lady of Fatima. Our Lady of Fatima is one of the most revered figures in Catholic tradition, embodying faith, hope, and divine intervention. Her story originates from the small village of Fátima in Portugal, where three shepherd children, Lucia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto, reported a series of Marian apparitions in 1917.

The apparitions began on May 13, 1917, when the children encountered a radiant figure, they described as "a Lady more brilliant than the Sun." Over the course of six months, the Lady appeared to them on the 13th of each month, delivering messages of prayer, repentance, and devotion to her Immaculate Heart. She also revealed three secrets, which included visions of hell, prophecies about global conflicts, and a call for the consecration of Russia to her Immaculate Heart.

One of the most extraordinary events associated with Our Lady of Fatima is the "Miracle of the Sun," witnessed by a crowd of approximately 70,000 people on October 13, 1917. The phenomenon involved the Sun appearing to dance in the sky, emitting multicolored light and seemingly plunging

toward the Earth before returning to its normal position. This event solidified the belief in the apparitions and drew global attention to Fátima.

The Catholic Church officially recognized the apparitions as worthy of belief in 1930, and the site of the apparitions, the Sanctuary of Our Lady of Fátima, has become a major pilgrimage destination. Devotees from around the world visit to honor the Virgin Mary and seek spiritual solace.

Our Lady of Fatima's messages continue to inspire millions, emphasizing the power of prayer, the importance of repentance, and the enduring hope for peace in the world. Her story serves as a reminder of the profound connection between faith and the human spirit.

My Brothers, may we learn to pray with a depth and urgency that brings us closer to our Lord and Savior and his Blessed Mother.

I struggled with what to write in this month's article. The original article has very graphic information, so contemplating on it caused me to change my mind for a more pleasant article. On Good Friday while praying the rosary and meditating on the scourging

and the crucifix of Jesus, I was led to go back to my original article. I was thinking of the terrible pain that Christ went through by his flesh being torn away from his bones, and the pain that babies go through during an abortion as the Sopher clamp is probing to find a body part that it can clamp on to and pull it from the body. Jesus went through his passion with full knowledge and willingly gave up his life. Babies in the womb are not aware of what is going on and try to move and avoid this foreign object that is trying to cause them harm. The baby scrims and moves but has nowhere to go, and eventually succumbs to being caught by the Sopher clamp and one-by-one of its body parts are torn from its body. The end was determined when a lance was thrust into the side of Jesus and blood and water poured from his body. And, when white fluid (brain) comes out of the uterus after the skull has been crushed, the abortionist knows that the baby has been killed and then the uterus is scrapped to make sure that all parts have been removed.

If you are still reading, we will now get to some real horrific information. What you are about to read is so terrifying – so horrific – that you may be tempted to think I'm exaggerating for shock value. I can assure you that I am not. Currently – right here in the United States – babies are being harvested for their organs while they are still alive. The information that I will be sharing is from investigation teams from two sources: The Survivors Inc. and The Center for Medical Progress.

There is basically three ways that the organs are being harvested:

Option #1: Live Dismemberment

In this scenario, the abortionist pulls off the limbs of the fetus and removes them with forceps from the womb. Special care is given not to crush the parts of the body that have been ordered. This dismemberment happens while the child is alive!

Option #2: Drowned in a bag of medical solution In this scenario, the abortionist induces labor to keep the child's organs intact. To preserve the body, the child is immediately placed into a bag of medical solution. Half of the babies harvested in this method are drowned alive!

Option #3: Organs harvested from the child after birth while alive

Like the scenario above, the abortionist induces labor so the child's body remains intact. To ensure the freshness of the organs, they are cut out from the child immediately after delivery... even when the child is alive!

Research shows that 50% of the babies in this procedure are born alive. This means that half of the babies harvested in the method are having their organs cut out from their body after birth while alive.

This organ harvesting nightmare is happening at University of California, San Francisco (UCSF), and the question is what are these human organs harvested used for?

Some of these experiments include:

- Transplanting fetal intestines onto the backs of young mice
- Implanting human reproductive tracts into mice
- Sewing the scalps of babies onto mice to grow human hair.

At the University of Pittsburgh they stitched SCALPS from five-month-old aborted babies on the backs of lab rats to keep the hair growing. The scientists also developed a protocol for harvesting the freshest, most pristine livers from five-month-old aborted babies to extract a massive number of stem cells so they could be experimentally transplanted into adults. These babies were aborted alive and then cut open to harvest the liver. If you would like to know how this is being funded, it is from a halfmillion-dollar "research" grant from Dr. Anthony Fauci's office at the National Institutes of Health (NIH). The University of Pittsburgh has applied for a \$3 million grant to harvest kidneys. They claim that they could use labor induction abortions where the baby is pushed out of the mother in a pre-term delivery. The plain meaning of what Pitt told the NIH in its grant application for taxpayer "research" money is that it would deliver premature babies alive with beating hearts and kill them by cutting their kidneys out. I hope you are paying attention to the fact that the "research" studies at Pitt are paid for with government and your tax dollars.

We have to stop these abominations in our country. These are just some of the reasons why I am so

deeply involved in pro-life. We must put an end to this abortion holocaust!
