GRAND KNIGHT MESSAGE

The Power of the Rosary and the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary

Brother Knights,

October is a month rich in spiritual meaning, and at its heart lies one of the most powerful devotions in our Catholic tradition, the Holy Rosary. This prayer, simple in form yet profound in depth, has been a source of grace, protection, and unity for centuries. As Knights of Columbus, we are called not only to serve but to pray, and the Rosary is one of our greatest tools in that mission.

The Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is October 7th. Today, we honor this feast not with swords and ships, but with beads and prayers, trusting that Our Lady continues to intercede for us in our own battles, whether personal, communal, or global.

In our own council, we have embraced this devotion as a cornerstone of our spiritual life. Before every business meeting, we gather to pray the Rosary together. This is more than a tradition. 40 Days for Life Current Statistics:

The fall campaign started Wednesday September 24th, with the kickoff on Tuesday September 23rd, and concludes on Sunday Nov 2.

On October 5th, Respect Life Sunday, we will be joining in with a National Life Chain to pray for the end of abortion. We will hold a rosary rally in front of the church along Lower Roswell on the sidewalk at 2:30pm. Signs will be provided and bring a chair.

Operation Rescue is a leading Christian activist organization dedicated to saving innocent preborn babies. Recently Operation Rescue uncovered a reported forced abortion that took place in Des Plaines, Illinois, Illinois has become known as the abortion capital of our country. So far this year, alone, Operation Rescue has already documented 16 women injured by eight abortion clinics in the state. NO clinics appear to have been disciplined. Earlier in the year, an anonymous plaintiff filed a lawsuit after Illinois abortionist Keith Reisinger-Kindle completely botched a late-term abortion procedure, tearing a quarter-sized hole in the plaintiff's uterus and leaving half of the child's dead body in her abdomen. Despite exhibiting complete incompetence and nearly killing a patient, so far Reisinger-Kindle has only been given a \$5,000 fine by the state and required to complete some continuing education hours. He is still fully licensed.

A month ago, Operation Rescue reported on yet another botched abortion. This time at a Planned Parenthood in Aurora that callously requested "no lights, no sirens" while a woman bled uncontrollably inside their clinic. Since 2011, Operation Rescue has investigated more than a dozen injuries at this abysmal clinic, including a critical uterine perforation just three years ago. It still remains open.

In June a woman who changed her mind about going through with her abortion after arriving at the

abortion clinic. However, when she tried to leave, the woman reports a male doctor and female nurse held her down until they could inject some sort of sedation into her left arm. Now drugged, the "duo" more easily got her onto an operating table where her child was forcibly aborted.

This is how women who experience abuse within the abortion industry are all too often treated. While abortion radicals protect incompetent abortionists like Keith Reisinger-Kindle, or violent abortionists like Adam Levy, a convicted child abuser in Nevada, or Jacob Kalo, a sexual predator in Michigan, women like this one pay the price — and no one on the side of abortion is willing to help them. Women injured, abused, or killed by the abortion industry are invisible to those who support it.

Women in Illinois have been left especially vulnerable. Besides the state no longer requiring abortion clinics to be licensed or regulated, resulting in rising numbers of women injured by abortion, the governor just signed bills expanding legal protections for abortionists, not patients, as well as protections for distributors of abortion drugs, not the women who may ingest them.

The Lieutenant Governor said, "Since Roe fell, we've worked hard to ensure that Illinois is a safe haven for reproductive freedom...."

Chemical Abortion Pills are leading killer of babies – and are poisoning our drinking water too!

Last year 648,500 Chemical Abortions were committed in the United States that can be documented. With the availability of ordering and receiving the Abortion Pill through the mail, not all abortions can be documented, so the actual number could be much higher. These baby bodies and placentas are virtually flushed down toilets and make their way into our drinking water and research shows that wastewater treatment plants DO NOT treat for the chemicals used in these abortions. Adding this up comes to more than 50 TONS of unregulated biological waste and contamination being flushed into our drinking water.

Most Americans have no idea that our drinking water is being polluted with human remains and traces of the very chemicals that are used to kill little boys and girls. And that these chemicals are harmful to them also!
